## FLY Federation FAQ

## What is the FLY Federation Council?

The FLY Federation Council is an advisory panel made up of one representative from each of the sixteen districts in the AFLC.

## What happens at the FLY Federation Council meeting?

It is a time to pray for the FLY Committee and the Convention, and to share ideas and ways to improve the FLY Convention.

## What is the responsibility of the District Representative?

1. To be in contact with pastors, youth leaders, and congregations within their district before the meeting to glean suggestions and ideas for the FLY Convention.
2. To attend the FLY Federation Council and share these suggestions and ideas from their district.
3. To be in prayer for the youth in their congregation, district, and the FLY Committee.
4. To be a district advocate for FLY - in sharing a report with their district after the meeting, passing on any additional comments from the district, and they also may be used to help communicate Convention information throughout the FLY cycle.

## Who should the district representative be?

Based on the nature of this involvement, three areas should be considered when choosing a representative for the FLY Federation Council:

1) An Involved Person. The individual chosen should be a member in good standing in a local congregation within the designated district.
2) A Youth-Oriented Person. The position would be best served by someone who understands the students of today and their culture. It may be a student or an adult. It may be a lay-leader or a pastor.
3) A Positive and Constructive Person. The person from your district should be someone who can share constructive ideas about the FLY Convention that will be beneficial to all involved.

## How do we choose a district representative?

It's up to each district. The By-Laws of FLY simply ask for the districts to choose. No direction is given on how each district decides; however it works best if it is a district-wide decision. Here are three methods which have been used in the past:

1) The representative is to be chosen at a District Pastors' Meeting.
2) The representative is chosen by the District Youth leaders.
3) The representative is chosen via phone calls or emails between churches and in the district.
